Introduction

Cyber security affects the lives of every Australian.

As technology continues to advance, Australians are spending more time online. This brings great connectivity and many opportunities – but can also expose the community to significant harm.

There is an urgent need for Australians to be proactive about increasing their cyber security knowledge and skills.

Act Now. Stay Secure. is an Australian Government campaign that is educating all Australians on the simple cyber safe behaviours that everyone can take every day to protect themselves online.

By sharing the resources in this kit, you are helping your community to learn the skills needed to safely and confidently embrace digital technologies and the opportunities they present. You are also contributing to a national initiative focused on supporting Australia to become one of the most cyber secure nations in the world by 2030, and reduce the economic and social impact of cybercrime.

The Act Now. Stay Secure. campaign launched in May 2025 and will run until March 2026. With the tagline 'What are you risking online?' the campaign is driving behavioural change by encouraging Australians to take simple cyber safe actions to improve their cyber security.

The three core cyber safe actions include:

Install all software updates to keep your devices secure

- Software updates fix weaknesses or gaps in your devices' security.
- Installing regular updates will keep your devices secure and makes it harder for cybercriminals to access them.
- Turn on automatic updates so you are notified when an update is available, and be sure to install software updates when prompted.

Use a unique and strong passphrase on every account

- A passphrase is a more secure version of a password.
- Strong passphrases should be over 15 characters long and use 4 or more random words.
- Use a different passphrase for each account. That way if one account's passphrase is compromised, your other accounts remain secure.

Always set up multi-factor authentication

- Multi-factor authentication requires two or more proofs of identity to log in to your account.
- This could include using your password or passphrase, as well as an authentication code from an authenticator app, email or text.
- Multi-factor authentication adds an extra layer of security. This makes it harder for cybercriminals to access your online accounts, even if one of your accounts' other authentication methods - such as a passphrase - has been compromised.



How to share the campaign resources

To support the *Act Now. Stay Secure.* campaign, the Department of Home Affairs has created a range of tools and resources to help individuals and organisations continue the cyber security conversation with their stakeholders and networks.

As an important stakeholder, you play a vital role in helping to increase cyber security awareness and empower people to undertake simple cyber safe actions consistently. This will turn cyber safe actions into an everyday habit – not an afterthought.

We encourage you to use the resources in this kit and share them with people in your community, your organisation and your networks. You can use the resources as they are or adapt them to suit your audiences and channels.

In this kit, you will find a range of resources and information including videos, audio assets, social media content, posters and a fact sheet.

The stakeholder kit also includes resources for First Nations people and translated resources available in 20 languages.

You can share the resources on your own channels to help spread the message and raise awareness of the *Act Now. Stay Secure*. campaign.
